Matthew 25:1-13 "Be Ready" April, 21 2024

Matthew 25:1–13 ESV

"Then the kingdom of heaven will be like ten virgins who took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. For when the foolish took their lamps, they took no oil with them, but the wise took flasks of oil with their lamps. As the bridegroom was delayed, they all became drowsy and slept. But at midnight there was a cry, 'Here is the bridegroom! Come out to meet him.' Then all those virgins rose and trimmed their lamps. And the foolish said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' But the wise answered, saying, 'Since there will not be enough for us and for you, go rather to the dealers and buy for yourselves.' And while they were going to buy, the bridegroom came, and those who were ready went in with him to the marriage feast, and the door was shut. Afterward the other virgins came also, saying, 'Lord, lord, open to us.' But he answered, 'Truly, I say to you, I do not know you.' Watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour.

Grow Group Discussion Questions

1.) What did God say to you through His Word during our Sunday gathering?

3.) How would you describe and differentiate between the wise and foolish bridesmaids in this passage and how might that apply to our lives today?

4.) Talk about the door being shut in this passage. What is the reality for the foolish? What is the reality for the wise? How should these realities direct our lives?

5.) What do you spend most of your time thinking about, eternal things or temporary?

6.) How does your daily life show that you care about Jesus? Is a self-examination of your actions after this passage tough to reflect on? How does the grace of Jesus Christ help in our weakness? (see 2 Corinthians 12) How can the community of believers encourage you or keep you accountable? (see Hebrews 10:24-25)
